Professional Development Requirements





Timeline for Completion (ORC3319.077)

Date	Teachers Required to Complete Training
Not later than the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year	General education and special education teachers providing instruction for students in K -1
Not later than the beginning of the 2024-2025 school year	General education and special education teachers providing instruction for students in grades 2 -3
Not later than the beginning of the 2025-2026 school year	Special education teacher ONLY in grades 4-12





Dyslexia Screening Requirements





Universal Screening Timeline

2023-24

- Students in grades K-3

 (Kindergarten students must be screened after January 1, 2024, but prior to January 1, 2025)
- Students in grades 4-6 as requested by a parent or a teacher with permission from parent

2024-25 and Beyond

- Students in Kindergarten

 (after the first day of January,
 but prior to the following
 January)
- Students in grades 1-6 as requested by a parent or a teacher with permission from parent





Actions After Tier 1 Screening

Identify each student that is at risk of dyslexia Identify and notify the student's parent or guardian **Progress** Progress monitor every two weeks for up to six Monitor weeks If no progress is observed during the monitoring period, Notify notify the parent and administer a tier two dyslexia screening measure to the student





Actions After Tier 2 Results

- Report to a student's parent or guardian the student's Tier 2
 screener results within thirty days after the measure's
 administration
- If a student demonstrates risk for dyslexia, provide the student's parents:
 - Information about reading development,
 - -The risk factors for dyslexia, and
 - Descriptions for evidenced-based interventions and;
 - A written explanation of the district or school's multi-sensory structured literacy program

Multidisciplinary Teams

Law	Districts must establish a multidisciplinary team to administer screening and intervention measures and analyze the results of the measures. The team must include trained and certified personnel and a stakeholder with expertise in the identification, intervention and remediation of dyslexia.
Guidance	 This stakeholder may be an educator with a multisensory structured literacy certification, a school psychologist with this expertise, a speech-language pathologist with this expertise or an individual from the community with specific expertise in dyslexia assessment. Districts may find it necessary or beneficial to reach out to partners outside of the district, such as educational service centers, when fulfilling this role.





Certification Requirements





Certification Process (ORC 3319.078)

Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, each city, local, and exempted village school district shall establish a structured literacy certification process for teachers providing instruction for students in grades kindergarten through three employed by the district. Each process shall align with the guidebook developed under section 3323.25 of the Revised Code.
