5:15 OSPA Staff Updates

Executive Director's Report

Ann Brennan

Legislative Update. You can go onto the legislative website to get updates on Senate Bills and House Bills. HB 360 Anti-bullying, passed through House but has been largely modified and sitting in senate to give buildings more discretion in discipline.

HB 512 wants to consolidate all departments to eliminate the school board of education to be a policy maker. OSPA is opposed to this and it is possible it will not leave the house.

HB 591- State report card revisions are recommended to be substantial.

SB 216 -Huffman public school deregulation did pass the senate. Can change grade bands and teacher evaluation provision

SB 246 - Lehner will likely get out of senate and we support this bill. This eliminates suspensions for children K-3 and puts more money in PBIS initiatives. Brennan submitted testimony, but unsure about support in house.

Goss inquired about SB 196-197 related to progressive discipline for bullying referrals. Brennan did not have an update regarding this but believes Lehner bill will go through and may be modified to potentially reflect this.

Graduation requirement Committee with recommendations by the next general assembly. There is also legislation related to this that could change requirements and may pass before state board completes it action.

Board of education is working on report card revisions with mostly superintendents and principals, including K-3 literacy and prepared for success component. The hope is the recommendations will be included in the revisions.

Board of Education Stephanie Dodd introduced a resolution of creating a guideline document for social-emotional-behavior wellness embedded in the curriculum. Opportunity for Keith Messmer to be on this committee and OPSA will nominate folks to be on this writing time. The anticipated timeline is October to see a draft.

Social-emotional standards Workgroup to write standards written through grade 8. Bradley Paramore and Ann Brennan have attended a few meetings. There is also writing efforts that will be anchored in CASEL guidelines. The timetable is expected to be about months.

Multi-agency work that is being done to establish toolkits to help schools delivery behavioral care. This came out of the governors health transformation project with medicaid director, ODE, OMH and many others working in this effort. Toolkits should be finalized end of May/Early June and will be sent to schools in improvement status but all schools can access these.

Related services shortage workgroup that ODE initiated has met a few times and will continue to so by end of September there will be recommendations. ESC recommended that the SPED cost analysis be updated to know what the costs are for the services. Kaitlyn Lang indicated that some of her related service providers would like provide input to that workgroup- Ann indicated that they can reach Dr. Monachino directly.

School Boards Association wants to plan a school safety summit by mid-September and team members are being identified. There will be a one-day summit with focus on behavioral health issues and school safety issues. Amity Noltemeyer and Brian Hill may be tapped as presenters, in addition to the PBIS committee.
